## Abortion

1) When does life begin?

#### Electoral Issues:

No. It would cost more. And, Idaho's 44 counties do not have anything near equal populations. Those with very few people would be given out-sized influence over the other counties. For example, Camas County has a population of 886, while Kootenai County has 153,605 (U.S. Census, May 2019).

7) Would you be in favor of a State Constitutional Amendment authorizing an Electoral College system in Idaho?

No. At first blush, it seems like it would just add another layer of government and complexity to local elections.

8) Would you be in favor of term limits for Idaho elected officials?

Yes.

9) Do you believe the country/state should move to a mail-in ballot system, or a computer voting system?

10) Should the primary election be changed to a later date?

I think the presidential primary and the state primary should be on the same date, whether it is in May, or any other month.

11) Should the election be changed to an all mail-in ballot system?

## Environmental Issues:

1) Should the government increase environmental regulations to prevent climate change?
