### **Abortion**

- 1) When does life begin? Life begins at conception.
- 2) Do you believe that Roe v. Wade is settled law? No, I do not, I believe it should be repealed and so does the law's namesake Jane Roe; whom has become an ardent anti-abortion activist.
- 3) Do you believe a woman has the right to choose to terminate her pregnancy? No, I do not.
- 4) Do you believe that our state should ban abortions? Yes, I do.
- 5) Do you believe that if our state should ban abortions, there should be exceptions for rape and incest? No, though these circumstances are dire and tragic one wrong does not excuse another wrong.

## **Criminal Justice**

- 1) Are you in favor of decriminalizing drug use? I am in favor of re-evaluation of current statutes as they pertain to drug use and DEA definitions and standards. I do not believe the "war on drugs" will be won through a prohibitionist approach.
- 2) Do you support the legalization of Marijuana? Yes, as stated above prohibition era policy has proven to be failed policy and the resultant black-market enables and emboldens criminal activity. #### **Economic Issues:**

- 2) Should the government use economic stimulus to aid the country during times of recession? ## **Education:**

- 1) Do you support charter schools? Absolutely.
- 2) Do you support Home schooling? Yes.
- 3) Do you believe that public schools are underfunded? No, and studies support that position. It isn't a matter of throwing more and more money at the problems our schools are facing, it's a matter of better utilizing the money that is available.
- 4) Should the Supplemental Levy/Plant Facilities Levy process be eliminated? Yes.

#### **Electoral Issues:**

- 1) Should the minimum voting age be lowered? If so, to what age? No.
- 2) Should a photo ID be required to vote? Yes 100% of the time.
- 3) Do you support a Constitutional Convention? The Founding Fathers saw fit to put that power into our hands as citizens. I do not believe that we need a Convention of the States at this time, however I do support the constitution and that includes Article V.
- 4) Should convicted criminals have the right to vote? Upon individual review, and after they have paid their debt to society, yes. - 5) Should all elections in Idaho be on the same date as the Primary/General elections only? The immediate benefit of protecting rural Idaho from urban population centers having carte blanche regarding policy is a reason why I would support this.
- 8) Would you be in favor of term limits for Idaho elected officials? Yes, and no. Yes, because, career politicians are a problem and often not representative servants in public office. Many/most have lost sight of what it means to be elected to serve. Politics was never meant to be a career, it is a service. No,

because, term limits are almost entirely ineffectual as elected officials are voted into office by their constituents, and removed by their constituents.

# **Foreign Policy:**

#### **Health Care:**

1) What would you do to lower health care costs? The single most effective thing we could do is get government out of the way of the private sector and let the free-market drive costs WAY down.

- 2) Should there be a plan in place before attempting to repeal Obamacare? There <u>should</u> have been a plan written and ready to go while President Obama was still in office. - 6) Should health insurers be allowed to deny coverage to individuals who have a preexisting condition? Yes, private business should have the right to refuse service to anyone. There are many organizations and charities that are set up in order to help in these instances.
- 7) Should the government require children and/or adults to be vaccinated for preventable diseases? No, the <u>Government should not have the power to mandate anything</u>.
- 8) Should terminally ill patients be allowed to end their lives via assisted suicide? I believe that God is the ultimate authority on life and death and that it is not my place, nor the place of Government to endorse or condone suicide.

# **Immigration:**

- 1) What steps would you take in our state to handle the immigration issues? Though the bulk of the immigration issues we are facing now is handled at the Federal level I would say that in my role as a County Commissioner I would work to ensure that no county programs are accessible for illegals and that our county offices and agencies work with Federal agencies in the enforcement of current immigration laws.

If a person seeks to become a citizen of the United States than that person should fully assimilate into the United States.

#### Lands:
